Department Highlights

Assessment & Strategic Initiatives

Published eight monthly updates with **100% participation** from departments in 2022.¹

Center for Sexuality & Gender Diversity

Trained **300 faculty, staff, and students** in the [Safe Zone I: QT 101](#) program during the summer.

Counseling & Psychological Services

Provided **631 telehealth appointments** over the summer, a **367% increase** from the prior year.²

Emily Taylor Center for Women & Gender Equity

Garnered **191 attendees** at the Free Feminist Friday Book Fair.

Health Education Resource Office

Promoted the Jayhawk Buddy System to over **3,000 attendees** of the Country Stampede Music Festival.

Hilltop Child Development Center

Enrolled **310 children** in August, a **4% increase** from the prior year.³

1. Completion rate was 80% over same period in 2021.
2. 135 telehealth appointments provided in summer 2021.
3. 297 children enrolled in August 2021.

KU Memorial Unions

Welcomed **8,500 students** to campus during UnionFest, a **42% increase** from the prior year.⁴

KU Recreation Services

Attracted **3,314 students** to Ambler Student Recreation Fitness Center during Rock the Rec, a **455% increase** from the prior year.⁵

KU Student Housing

Hosted over **2,500 guests** for summer camps and conferences, totalling **\$650,000 in revenue**.

Legal Services for Students

Offered attorney-client legal assistance to **304 students**, a **2% decrease** from the prior year.⁶

Office of Multicultural Affairs

Coordinated with **18 multicultural student organizations** to welcome students to campus.

Sexual Assault Prevention & Education Center

Trained **4,000 first-year students** through [Jayhawks Give a Flock](#) during Hawk Week, a **2% increase** from 2019.⁷

Sorority & Fraternity Life

Opened **123 conduct cases** in August, a **38% increase** from the prior year.⁹

Student Money Management Services

Assisted **69 students** through individual appointments, a **527% increase** from the prior year.¹⁰

Student Support & Case Management

Received **78 student referrals** over the summer, a **37% increase** from the prior year.¹¹

Student Involvement & Leadership Center

Assembled **172 departments and student organizations** to promote involvement opportunities, a **29% increase** from the prior year.¹²

Watkins Health Services

Provided **566 COVID-19 tests**, a **7% increase** from the prior year.¹³
