Department Highlights

Center for Sexuality & Gender Diversity

Increased KU's Campus Pride Index score to **4.5 out of 5.**¹ KU's LGBTQ campus inclusion now **ranks second** in Kansas.²

Counseling & Psychological Services

Provided direct services and/or financial assistance last fall semester to **72 students** who experienced sexual violence.³

Emily Taylor Center for Women & Gender Equity Legal Services for Students Assisted 743 students and international inte

Hosted the "Femme Frequencies" concert benefitting the STA CARE Center with **50 people** in attendance.

Health Education Resource Office

Facilitated a "Sex in the Dark" educational program for **150 student participants**, a **200% increase** from March 2022.⁴

Hilltop Child Development Center

Cared for **311 children** with assistance from **61 student aides**, increases of **4% and 22 %** from March 2022, respectively.⁵

KU Memorial Unions

Kansas Esports hosted **450 in-person attendees** and **95,000 Twitch viewers** at the 7th Annual Sweet Spot Smash Event.

Provided **16 educational and awareness programs**. The amount of programs offered is **equivalent** to March 2022.⁹

Panhellenic Association selected **85 recuitment counselors** for formal recuitment, a **5% increase** from 2022.¹⁰

Provided medical services to 1,105 walk-in patients, a 39% increase from March 2022.¹⁵
