Department Highlights

■ Center for Sexuality & Gender Diversity

Recognized 113 student graduates at Lavender Graduation, a 1.300% increase from April 2022.1

Counseling & Psychological Services

Conducted 21 urgent care and triage appointments with students, a **75% increase** from April 2022.²

■ Emily Taylor Center for Women & Gender Equity

Hosted the "Solo Sex Ed" and "Vibrator Bingo" programs with 150 people in attendance.

Health Education Resource Office

Engaged **204 participants** at the Jayhawk Buddy System Instagram launch event.

Hilltop Child Development Center

Cared for 312 children with assistance from 82 student aides, increases of 4% and 49 % from April 2022, respectively.³

KU Memorial Unions

Welcomed 8,729 participants to SUA events, an 83% increase from April 2022.4
